SUBJECT: 11th Wing Installation Environmental Commitment Statement

1. The 11th Wing's mission is to provide national security and support for the nation's capital and provide interagency cooperation. JBAB provides installation support to over 18,000 military and civilian employees as well as their families, military dependents, and mission and tenant units, including ceremonial units, Army, Navy, and Coast Guard commands, White House Communications Agency, Presidential Marine Helicopter Squadron (HMX-1), Defense Intelligence Agency, and the District of Columbia (DC) Army National Guard.
2. The 11th Wing is committed to improving environmental performance and management practices, ensuring environmental compliance, and minimizing pollution and waste streams. The collective mission success of the 11th Wing and its partners requires daily operations in the land, air, and riparian environments. Protecting each is required to accomplish the installation's mission.
3. JBAB is committed to complying with Federal and local environmental regulations while preventing pollution, minimizing waste streams, and cleaning up historical sites of environmental concern without compromising the mission. We will communicate our environmental commitments and performance to all levels of our organization and the local community. We are committed to working with District environmental agencies to accomplish the following:
 - a. Promote Restoration of the Anacostia and Potomac Rivers Through Partnerships and Adherence to Stormwater Regulations and Permits
 - b. Reduce and Control Air Emissions
 - c. Protect Cultural and Natural Resources
 - d. Adapt to and Mitigate Climate Change and Sea Level Rise
4. We will establish and maintain a Cross Functional Team comprised of leadership and Unit Environmental Coordinators to monitor progress in achieving our goals and objectives. The Scope of the Environmental Management System (EMS) includes all units on JBAB that have operations that could potentially impact the environment and do not fall under a separate EMS. Adherence to these commitments and the continual improvement of our EMS support our core mission.
5. Compliance with environmental regulations and this policy is the responsibility of all military, civilian, tenant, and contract personnel in accordance with their roles and responsibilities.
